## **RESTORATION**

This year we have been concentrating on works on the exterior of the building to try reduce damp & mildew. One issue is that the toilet floors inside are 6 inches below the outside ground level, to reduce the problem channels have been dug down as far as possible along the outside walls and cemented with ACOS drains.

Improving guttering, downspouts and drains

Hatch has been lowered with new shutters

Shutters in main hall & 4 high windows

Floor boards and joists have been repaired/replaced at north-west end

Walls at east & west end re-pointed with lime mortar and missing stones replaced, high windows resealed, wooden fascia replaced with wood look-alike black plastic.

Stonework at both ends at lower levels will be re-pointed when weather permits.

Inside - insulation of main false ceiling in the hall and reflective foil installed behind radiators

Soon new exterior door at east end and then a new fire-door at west end.

Last Saturday had professional deep clean of toilets

## APPLICATION FOR A GRANT TO LOTTERY 'AWARDS FOR ALL'

To help us achieve our aims of making the hall warmer, more welcoming and thereby improving footfall

If successful work will include: Removing ceiling in Ladies toilet to be able to insulate new ceiling effectively and access electrics and replace wiring affected by rodent damage, try to rodent-proof area, larger access hatch.

Insulate walls where appropriate in toilets

Improving plumbing and extend piping from hot water tank in ladies to gents hand-basin remove existing small electric water heater

Ventilation & low powered background heating in toilets

Motion sensor for lighting in gents toilets

Lay flooring in toilets if moisture levels allow

All lighting to change to LED: strip lighting replaced, wall lights to be installed on north & south walls Install additional sockets on north & south walls. Removal of hanging heaters.
