It was caused by a combination of a senile poultry keeper (myself) who forgot to shut the hens in at dusk and what can only have been a family of teenage fox cubs looking for a bit of fun. 16 dead hens inside their shed and strewn around the field, 5 missing completely. Anyone who keeps hens has to put up with a fox taking the odd hen, but this was carnage. A very upsetting sight. The remaining hens are rallying from the stress and there is 60% of the normal eggs in the box. I have ordered some more pullets for Augus and all should be back to normal by the autumn. In the meantime, I apologise to our much valued customers if there aren't always eggs in the box. Rob.

RULES

The Hall will open between 10 am and 12 noon on the day of the show for the delivery of exhibits. All entries must be in the Village Hall ready for judging by 12 noon.

Judging will take place between 12pm and 2pm when the Hall will be closed to the public.

All sections are open to adults and children but will be judged separately.

No competitor may enter more than two entries in any one class. Exhibits must not have been shown in a previous show.

The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in connection with the show.

All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor in their garden or allotment. In other sections, the exhibits must be the individual work of the exhibitor.

Points for cups: 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.

In the case of an exhibitor winning two prizes in a class, only the highest counts towards the cup.

The committee shall decide on any matter not covered by these rules.

The decision of the judge is final. Judges have the power to withhold prizes should the exhibits or number of entries be, in their opinion, unworthy of the prize.



Garden Advice from Bow Garden Centre

August is the perfect month to relax and enjoy your garden. Take a look at what needs doing in the garden this month.

- 1. Use a hedge trimmer to cut laurel hedges to avoid half-cut leaves turning brown.
- 2. Deadhead flowering plants like roses and petunias regularly to encourage them to flower.
- 3. Plant Autumn bulbs in your pots & borders, such as nerines, colchicums and sternbergia.
- 4. Feed your baskets and containers regularly with Westland Boost Liquid feed to encourage flowers to bloom into early Autumn. In the height of Summer, feed once a week early morning or late evening, never in the heat of the day.
