VILLAGE HALL

The AGM was attended by 34 people. The Treasurer reported an income of £19,013 including £11,000 in grants and expenditure of £29,028 of which £24,899.29 was on Hall improvements. The balance held is £36,545.50.

Three Committee Members are retiring this year who have contributed a tremendous amount: Sue & Martyn Down have served on the Committee for over 25 years and now in retirement from work they want to be free to maximise use of their caravan. Sue has kindly offered to continue, for now, with Bingo and the Flower Shows; and Jan Summers after 12 years of service, four as Secretary. She intends to continue her baked goods stall at the market. It wasn't necessary to hold a vote for the Committee as there were 6 candidates for the 6 seats, so returned unopposed are: Claire Lewis, Margaret Harris, Simon Allanson Bailey, Mike Bostock, Stella Beavan, Erica Eden, the three representatives are Peter Heal [Parish Council], Delia Wainwright [WI], Tina Young [Parochial Church Council].

The Chair reported on the restoration work done this year. Guttering, downspouts and drains have all received work to reduce ingress of water, damp and mildew. As the toilets' interior floors are 6" deeper than the exterior ground, channels against the exterior walls have been dug as deep as possible and cemented with ACOS drains. The serving hatch lowered with new shutters. Window shutters were fitted in the main hall. Floor boards and joists have been repaired/replaced at north-west end of the main hall. Walls at east & west end re-pointed with lime mortar and missing stones replaced, high windows re-sealed, wooden fascia replaced with wood look-alike black plastic. Stonework at lower levels at both ends will also be re-pointed when weather permits. Insulation of main false ceiling in the hall and reflective foil installed behind radiators. Coming soon new exterior door at east end and new fire-door at west end.

Future work is partially dependant [sic] on the success of our external funding application; it is hoped to do the following : work to reduce damp & mildew, insulation, larger access hatches, rodent proofing where possible in the toilets; piping hot water from the ladies to gents hand-basin, removing the existing electric water heater; install ventilation & low powered background heating for all and a sensor for lighting in gents toilets. Lastly, lay flooring in toilets if moisture levels allow. Hall lighting to change to LED: strip lighting replaced, wall lights to be installed on north & south walls. Install additional sockets on north & south walls. Removal of hanging heaters.

None of what we do would happen without the goodwill of those on the committee who give their time, energy, experience & skills, often spending their own money making food, providing draw prizes etc. After the AGM people enjoyed wine, cheese and a slide show of 50 years of Zeal life.

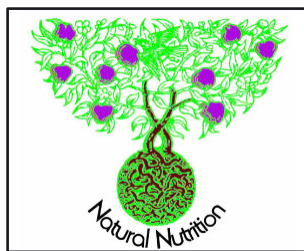

A NEW YEAR, A HEALTHY NEW YOU?

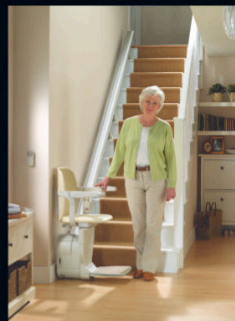

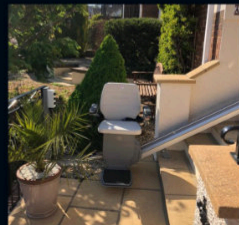

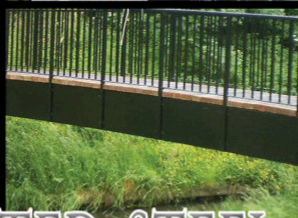

JANUARY Garden Advice

Kick off the New Year
by preparing for a flourishing
growing season ahead, with
January Gardening Advice,
courtesy **Bow Garden Centre.**

1. Recycle your Christmas tree by shredding it for mulch.
2. Dig over any vacant plots that have not been dug already. Turning the soil will expose pests to hungry birds, helping you keep your pest population under control.
3. Protect any tender plants with fleece or take them into the greenhouse.
4. Prune Apple and Pear trees while they are dormant, between leaf fall and bud burst, and apply Winter tree wash and pheromone moth traps. Now is a great time to do this.
5. Use this time to carry out any repair work in your garden. Fix fences, garden gates and furniture now, ready for the Spring
6. Take a walk around your Winter garden, and look for gaps where you could add some Winter colour.
7. Plan, plan, plan! Whilst you've got some time spare, take a minute to plan your garden for Spring time planting. Bow Garden Centre have a large selection of seeds and bulbs in store to choose from, so you can start planning now!
8. Get your propagation needs now - such as seed compost, plant pots and trays. Be prepared so that you are ready to get ahead for the season.
9. If you have planted potatoes in planters take them into the greenhouse to avoid them getting frost damage.
10. Continue to provide food and water for birds. It's particularly hard for them this time of year with the cold weather conditions and reduction in the number of food sources accessible to them.

ZEAL PARISH COUNCIL

There was a Parish Council meeting held on 28th November.

There were several planning applications to be discussed. All were approved. The problem of having meetings every other month meant that planning applications regularly fall between two successive meetings, resulting in special meetings and site visits having to be arranged by the clerk, not always successfully. After discussion, plans were agreed to try and get around this problem.

Representatives from Monachorum Matters discussed their finances with the meeting. It was disclosed that although some cost cutting measures had been carried out, expenditure would still exceed income by about £300. The meeting voted unanimously that the parish council should make up the shortfall and that it would be reviewed annually. It was suggested that the Village Hall committee and the Church Council should be approached for donations.

There were no MDDC members present but Margaret Squires represented the DCC. She outlined the rapidly increasing costs of caring for children with special needs, an issue in which she has always taken a keen interest. She announced that she wouldn't be standing for re-election at next May's election. At least 16 years of standing as a County Councillor, she has always been helpful to us, a hard act to follow.

DCC would like each parish to provide a snow warden to coordinate any emergencies. Anybody willing to put their name forward? Hopefully they won't ever be busy!

As has already been mentioned in Monachorum Matters, the fishing club have received a donation from the DDC Locality Budget to purchase an electricity generator. If any groups in the parish are thinking of applying for the Den Brook fund the next closing date is January 31st 2025 and then July 31st 2025. The application forms have been updated and old ones will not be accepted, so please make sure you have an up to date form—see pager 17.

Members wished to thank Sally Rowden and her helpers for another excellent Remembrance Day display. The date of the next meeting is January 22nd and not January 30th as might be expected. This is to comply with the Council's precept deadline.

The meeting closed at 8.10 pm.

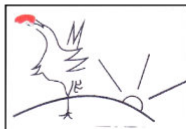
